## Victorian Age (13-18yrs) Short Course Championships

8 swimmers attended the Victorian SC Championships at MSAC over  $2^{nd} - 4^{th}$  September. The club did exceptionally well with Mal Bradley, Nathan Foote, Jarrod Muir and Lily Robinson making finals and Luke Malherbe finishing as  $2^{nd}$  emergency for the 200 BR final.

After missing the final of the 200m Backstroke by 0.03 in a massive PB swim, Jarrod Muir brought a hunger to the 100m Backstroke to qualify for his first State Final in 9<sup>th</sup> place. He then ramped it up again in the final to finish 6<sup>th</sup>.

Nathan Foote continued his great form in the Backstroke events to claim the Gold and Silver in the 200m and 100m Backstroke respectively and will now go on to take on the best in Australia at State Teams in Canberra in 2 weeks.

It was going to take something special to claim the Bronze in the 200m Breaststroke and Lily proved she was up to the task with a 2 second PB to seal the Bronze against a very hotly contested event.

Mallory Bradley swam admirably in the heats and then managed to take it up a notch in the Finals with PB's in both events to finish 6<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> in the 200m and 100m Breaststroke respectively.

Eric Zubcic was up against a fast field in the 200m Breaststroke and having only recently turned 15, he was up against some much bigger opposition. Eric still managed to finish 13<sup>th</sup> with a 5 second PB and put himself in a great position leading into the long course season.

Kai Lumsden was impressive throughout the weekend, showing that he is not just a Freestyler. Racing in the 17-18 year old age group is never an easy task, especially as a 17 year old but Kai swam big PB's in both the 100 FLY and BR to take himself up the ranking and finish mid 20's along with the 100m Freestyle.

Luke Malherbe was in the same positons as Kai as a 17 year old but still managed 2 great swims in the 100m and 200m Breaststroke. Luke finished 12<sup>th</sup> in the 200m Breaststroke and was 8<sup>th</sup> amongst the 17 year olds.

Isabelle O'Neill was competing at her first State Champs over the weekend and raced exceptional throughout the competition. After some hard training months in the pool, it all paid off with 3 PB's and a huge jump on the rankings. Issie is certainly a swimmer to watch out for this season and I expect this is only a glimpse of what she will achieve this year.
